A VIEW FROM THE REAR... by Joe Coleman

At the December general membership meeting, the club proposes the cruising schedule for the upcoming year. Many of the cruising destinations are pretty well planned by local events, such as Mardi Gras in Cocoa Village, St. Patrick's Day in Melbourne, and the Christmas boat parade in Satellite Beach. Some have become traditional by popular demand, such as the Memorial Day cruise to the park at Sebastian Inlet. Every year we seem to have a problem getting cruisers to volunteer to host all the cruises and we end up having the same people hosting the same cruises over and over. It's not that we don't appreciate their volunteering, but it would be nice to have new people with new ideas step up to host some of the rendezvous.

Hosting a cruise is not difficult or complicated. Basically the host only has to do three things. One is to plan the event, two is to keep track of who attends, and three is to write a short report about the cruise for the newsletter. I can easily describe these three elements.

Planning the cruise is nothing more than saying where we are going to go and what we will do when we get there. It can be as simple as "We all sail to Cocoa Village, meet at the gazebo at seven o'clock, and go listen to some music" or "We will all meet at the Mexican restaurant and eat as a group and then you are on your own". EAST COAST SAILING ASSOCIATION GENERAL MEETING OCTOBER 12, 2005

The meeting was called to order by Commodore Dave Merchberger at 7:00 p.m. Board members present were: Dave Merchberger, Joe Luthman, Joe Coleman, Phyllis Paradies, Wes Whitley and Chip Worster.

After the introduction of Board members, fleet captains, committee chairmen, and past commodores, Dave welcomed all including guests and new members attending for the first time.

COMMODORE:

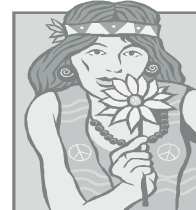
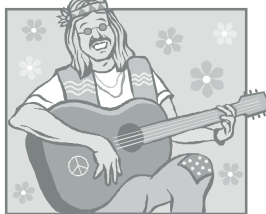
